Position Description:

Provides service coordination and access to Jordan's Principle (where applicable) to Two-Spirit, Indigenous families as well as non-Indigenous families with children and youth with developmental disabilities between the ages of 0 to 18 years with a specific focus on working

with Indigenous children and youth and their families. You will be required to coordinate services both within 2-Spirited People of the 1st Nations, Surrey Place and in the community.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

- Assesses and collaborates with Two-Spirit, Indigenous and non-Indigenous families to determine service needs
- Makes referrals to other community agencies and services as required
- Incorporates information from families and provides information to the interdisciplinary team, and/or other sources both internal and external as required in the preparation of service plans
- Provides information to clients, caregivers, service providers and staff on the availability and appropriateness of community services and funding support
- Participates in service coordination group meetings and chairs case conferences as required
- Other duties as required.

Qualifications:

- Must have extensive experience working with Indigenous populations and a broad familiarity with Indigenous cultural and community perspectives across Ontario.
- Must have proven demonstration of understanding the range of issues facing Indigenous youth in Ontario
- May have an undergraduate degree in social or health sciences or equivalent
- 3 years of related experience
- Experience working with children and youth with developmental disabilities and their families
- Knowledge of developmental services and educational, community, and health care service systems for children with developmental disabilities
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills
- Experience on an interdisciplinary team and with multicultural environments is an asset
- The successful candidate must provide an acceptable Vulnerable Sector Screening
- Proficient with Microsoft Office and Zoom. Experience using Google Docs/forms/sheets an asset.
- Must be fluent in English: fluency in an Indigenous language and/or French language is an asset.
