A MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

The past year has been a year of growth, challenges and learnings. In January of 2022, we were given the go ahead for our Indigenous Mental Health Crisis Response Pilot team, from there we had a swift timeline to get up and running by July. On July 11th, we launched our Indigenous led mental health crisis response team (TCCS) and have been operating 24/7 since then. 2-Spirits has also begun consultations around provincial expansions, and we are currently working on a 2-Spirit Emergency Shelter proposal. What a whirlwind this year has been!

Since starting with this agency about 5 years ago, I have seen 2-Spirits transition through many different seasons. It has been so rewarding to see the growth, hard work and determination our team, community and board has put into making 2-Spirits what it is today. I am so very proud to be a part of this team and the community here within Toronto. The strength, resilience, self-determination, knowledge, humour, kindness and love our community carries is beautiful. I look forward to seeing what is in store for 2-Spirits in the next 5 years.

TORONTO COMMUNITY CRISIS SERVICE

The Toronto Community Crisis Service (TCCS) is a new, alternate approach to responding to someone in crisis that focuses on health, prevention and well-being. The service provides an alternative to police enforcement, creating a community-based, client centred, trauma-informed response to non-emergency crisis calls and wellness checks. This service aims to respond to the needs and desires of the communities most impacted by policing and establish trust and confidence in a new community-based response model.

The Indigenous led crisis response team responds to mental health related crisis and wellness checks for individuals located within Division 14, and Indigenous identifying individuals in Divisions 51/52.

Kamaamwizme wii Naagidiwendiiying is rooted in community, it is relational, trauma informed, non-aggressive, and aims to always centre the individual in our approach to supporting their wholistic health and wellness. Culture and traditional ways of being are

fundamental to supporting community. Our approach is flexible and responsive to the varying needs of people in crisis and those around them.

211: The main access point is 211, where individuals in crisis or 2nd party callers can call 211 and be connected to a 211 dispatcher. Your call will then be dispatched to our crisis team.

2-Spirits has also launched and Indigenous led and operated crisis line that is available to those living within the GTA from 2pm-2am 7 days a week. To access the team, please call 416-363-2999.

We have just celebrated our one year of service with a community gathering, over the last year we have responded to nearly 2000 crisis response calls. We look forward to continuing to expand and to make these services accessible to all Indigenous folks through the GTA.

THIS ENDEAVOR REPRESENTS A POWERFUL UNION OF TRADITION, IDENTITY, AND RESILIENCE. THE TWO-SPIRIT INDIVIDUALS, **REVERED FOR OUR UNIQUE ROLES AS** MEDIATORS BETWEEN THE SPIRITUAL AND PHYSICAL REALMS, HAVE HISTORICALLY HELD A SACRED PLACE WITHIN INDIGENOUS CULTURES. BY CRAFTING THIS GRAND AND RESONANT DRUM, WE ARE NOT ONLY REVIVING A TRADITIONAL ROLE BUT ALSO REKINDLING A PROFOUND CONNECTION TO OUR ANCESTORS. THIS REMARKABLE UNDERTAKING SERVES AS A SYMBOL OF UNITY AND CULTURAL **REVITALIZATION, AS IT BEATS WITH THE** HEARTBEAT OF OUR DIVERSE TWO-SPIRIT IDENTITIES AND THE RICH HERITAGE THAT HAS SUSTAINED OUR COMMUNITIES FOR GENERATIONS. OVER THE PAST YEAR, THIS DRUM HAS TRAVELED TO OWEN SOUND AND THUNDER BAY, CARRYING WITH IT THE SPIRIT AND STORIES OF ITS CREATORS AND THEIR COMMITMENT TO PRESERVING THE TRADITIONS AND NARRATIVES OF TWO-SPIRIT PEOPLE IN THESE COMMUNITIES.

IN 2022, THE 2-SPIRITED PEOPLE OF THE 1ST NATIONS EMBARKED ON A JOURNEY ACROSS ONTARIO IN THE HOPES OF FINDING AND CONNECTING WITH THE **GREATER 2-SPIRIT COMMUNITY TO BUILD RELATIONSHIPS** AND A NETWORK OF CULTURALLY SUPPORTIVE AND SAFE **RESOURCES. 2-SPIRIT COLLABORATOR, MISSY FISHMAN** LED THE PROJECT AS OUR STAFF TRAVELLED TO MANY NATIONS AND CITIES, MEETING WITH COMMUNITY LEADERS, ELDERS, FAMILIES, ORGANIZATIONS AND SERVICE PROVIDERS THAT SERVE THE 2-SPIRIT. INDIGENOUS OR LGBTQIA+ COMMUNITIES TO DISCUSS THE SAFE SPACES AND SERVICES FOR 2-SPIRIT INDIVIDUALS IN THEIR REGION. THE INFORMATION GATHERED WAS THEN COMPILED INTO A DIGITAL 2-SPIRIT RESOURCE GUIDE THAT CAN BE EASILY ACCESSED ONLINE FROM OUR 2SPIRITS.ORG HOMEPAGE.

THROUGH THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE RESOURCE GUIDE, WE HAD THE OPPORTUNITY TO EXPLORE WHERE THE PROGRAMMING AND SUPPORTS ARE, WHILE ALSO RECOGNIZING THE GAPS AND INADEQUACIES THAT ARE APPARENT AS WELL. MOVING FORWARD, WE WILL BE WORKING TO ASSIST AND COLLABORATE WITH THOSE COMMUNITIES THAT NEED GREATER 2-SPIRIT SAFE SPACES AND SERVICES IN THE WAY THAT IS OPTIMAL FOR THEM.



THIS GROUP STARTED IN FEBRUARY OF 2022 AS A SPACE FOR 2-SPIRITED, QUEER, INDIGENOUS YOUTH TO GATHER AND SHARE THEIR KNOWLEDGE OF THE HAND DRUM AND THE SONGS THEY CARRY. OUR GOAL HAS BEEN TO DEMONSTRATE THAT YOUTH HAVE THE CAPACITY TO BE LEADERS; WE AIM TO INSPIRE FELLOW INDIGENOUS YOUTH AS WELL AS NON-INDIGENOUS FOLKS TO LISTEN TO THE VOICES OF THE NEXT GENERATION.

ZHAWENIM HAS BEEN ABLE TO PERFORM FOR A VARIETY OF COMMUNITY EVENTS INCLUDING THE 2-SPIRITED PEOPLE OF THE 1ST NATIONS ANNUAL POWWOW, THE OPENING OF PRIDE TORONTO, A STEELHEADS HOCKEY GAME, AND SHARE A LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT AT BOYGENIUS' CONCERT FOR 16000 PEOPLE.

WE HAVE FOUND FRIENDSHIP, COMMUNITY, AND KNOWLEDGE WITHIN THE DRUM GROUP. IT HAS BECOME A SACRED SPACE WHERE WE CAN EXIST AS WE ARE.


























PRIDE 2023

OUR SUNDAY STAGE, LOCATED AT CHURCH STREET AND DUNDAS STREET, HAD 9 PERFORMERS. PERFORMANCES ON BOTH DAYS INCLUDED DJ'S, DRAG, BURLESQUE, BANDS, SINGERS AND DANCERS. AT THE SUNDAY STAGE WE ALSO PROVIDED A FEAST FOR THOSE WHO WALKED IN THE PARADE AND ATTENDED THE STAGE. WE ALSO HAD 6 VENDOR BOOTHS SETUP THAT WERE PROVIDED BY TORONTO PRIDE.
